**Film registrations are now open for the 6th edition (2024) of the FIFAC.
An international festival dedicated to the best in creative documentary and digital content.**

FIFAC will be held in Saint-Laurent du Maroni in French Guiana from 08 to 12 October 2024. For 5 days, the festival will bring together directors, producers, broadcasters, audience and schoolchildren around a selection of works from the Amazon and Caribbean area. On the agenda: screenings, previews, debates, master classes, professional events and festive moments...

The competition is open to films produced from 1 January 2023 onwards. They must relate to the Guiana, Amazon and Caribbean regions and may cover all themes: social, economic, ethnological, animal, historical, cultural and heritage.

The festival opens its selection to two types of production: creative documentaries (short and feature-length) and digital documentary creations (web docs, web series, interactive experiences, animations, works in virtual reality or 360, experimental montages).

Selected films may be presented in the competitive section or out of competition in other categories: Parallel screenings, Fokus, Special screenings. The films selected for competition will compete for 5 awards :
Best documentary Film FIFAC - France Télévisions/ Jury Award/ Best Short Film Award/ High School Students Award/ Public Award.
